

The Furniture and Furnishings (Fire) (Safety) Regulations 1988 (SI 1988/No.1324) and the amendments of 1989 (SI 1989/No. 2358) and 1993 (SI 1993/No. 207) set levels of fire resistance for domestic upholstered furniture, furnishings and other products containing upholstery. The products covered by the regulations include the following where they have a filling material:

- Furniture for use in a private dwelling.
- Beds, headboards and mattresses
- Sofa beds, futons and other convertible furniture
- Nursery furniture
- Garden furniture
- Furniture in caravans
- · Scatter cushions, bean bags, pillows and seat pads
- And the regulations also apply to Loose Covers for upholstered furniture
