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3. EXEMPTIONS

The following items are exempted from Verification of Conformity for products to be imported to Central African Republic:

- Minimum value subject to the program USD 1'500.-
- Personal effects with minimum FOB value below USD 3'000
- Non-Commercial value postal shipments and express courier
- Commercial samples
- Donation from foreign governments or international organizations to foundations, welfare and human organizations recognized of public interest
- Personal gifts
- Humanitarian goods from foreign Governments, organizations or individuals in case of disaster
- Gifts and supplies imported by consular and diplomatic missions, or United Nations sponsored organizations for their own use
- Goods purchased with donations and external funds

Coverage and Conditions

The above fees cover the documentary verification and digital remote inspection of goods. In the event that a physical inspection is required (technical incapacity for a remote inspection) an additional fee of EUR 200 will be charged.

The above fees **do not include** the following activities:

- Bulk shipment sampling
- Laboratory testing
- Licensing and registration
- Manufacturing audit
- Containers sealing

These services will be invoiced directly by SGS on a case by case basis

The SGS fee shall be calculated on the basis of the value of the invoice presented by the exporter.
